12-Year **Program (TYP)**

- Pennsylvania's official midrange planning tool
- Lists statewide planned projects and assigns funding to projects over a 12-year period
- Represents all modes and means of transportation



Safety

- PennDOT's highest transportation priority
- Safety improvement initiatives include awareness campaigns, behavioral programs, and infrastructure improvements
- The COVID-19 pandemic greatly impacted how road users traveled in 2020-2021 and may continue influencing trends in the future






Proactive Safety Planning

 Active Transportation Plan: PennDOT's plan to provide safe, reliable facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists and other vulnerable road users

 Safety Plan: Pennsylvania's blueprint to reduce fatal and serious injury crashes






Automated Speed Enforcement

 Act 86 of 2018: introduced automated speed enforcement pilot program in PA work zones


State Transportation Advisory
 Committee recommended

Mobility

- Developing and enhancing tools to monitor traffic congestion
 - o 511PA.com
 - Message boards with travel times
 - Construction updates
 - Social media notifications
- National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) plan: will provide PA more than \$171 million over five years





Mobility Implications

2022 Transportation Advisory
 Committee study identified
 \$53.5 million funding gap for aviation

 Post-pandemic transit ridership decline has created an ongoing challenge in pursuit of a return to form





Preservation

- The number of state bridges in poor condition has been driven down to just 9.5%
- The number of local bridges in poor condition is now at a decade-low
- Act 89 of 2013 vehicle registration fee has raised \$216 million for local projects





Roadway Preservation


- PennDOT Transportation Asset
 Management Plan: data-driven
 approach to cost-effective
 improvements
- PA roadway network pavement conditions continue to improve in recent years

Did You Know: PA's state-owned roadway network is roughly the same size as New York, New Jersey, and New England's networks combined



Accountability

- Over 90% of highway construction projects completed on time over the last decade
- Transit performance: SEPTA and Pittsburgh Regional Transit received federal recognition for their service
- Mentor Protégé Program: enhancing ability of Small Diverse Businesses to compete for PennDOT contracting opportunities





Funding

Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)

- \$2.34 billion for highway programs in PA
- \$1.76 billion for bridge replacements and repairs in PA

BIL Grant Program Opportunities

- Electric vehicles
- Safety programs
- Reconnecting communities
- 12-Year Program plays an important role in planning and delivering these opportunities





Freight

 2045 Freight Movement Plan: Updated in 2022, makes PA eligible for \$58.5 million annually in federal freight funding

 Freight Work Group: organized by PennDOT to support freight planning activities and updates to the Freight Movement Plan

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
